Additionally, connecting the multiple borough properties in Honesdale to provide improved recreational opportunities.

WPTWA Steering Committee Members stated that the feasibility study is the first step to inform people and understand the scope of the project. They believe these trails will be life-changing for all, improving the quality of life in our region, and will be advantageous for the local economy through increased visitors.
